
Week 9- Bentley Hay

Attendance

Our week 9 and 10 school's attendance rate was **91.0%**.

Attendance rate has lowered over the past few weeks. Data has shown that students who attend school each day are more likely to achieve at or above satisfactory level in curriculum areas, then those that take days off school.

1 day off school each fortnight = 10 days or 2 weeks off a semester.

If students are taking more than 1 day off each fortnight then this may have a large impact on their learning as well as their interaction and relationships with peers.


